Overview of 2017-2020 State Plan Process – Traci/Katy:

Current plan expires in 2017

Traci was involved in the last planning process.

Development process included a summit of a couple 100 people from the 6 core sectors, and 100's of key informant interviews.

More task forces than last time, 8 task forces, weren't as robust as they are now. The new plan will rely on the task forces to help shape it as well as each of the commissioners, and an ad hoc group of police representatives.

1st plan was something anyone could follow but it was huge, this plan will be much more user friendly and accessible.

The chairs of each task force have met to approve the template.

Timeline:

Template was due in Dec.

Each Task force will do a presentation on the 1st round of recommendations in April.

The Plan will be finalized on Oct. 1st.

The Center will draft a plan and then send it out to the Governor's Commission.

Need to confirm the submission date, but it will be close to the finalized date.

This task force will need to create an ad hoc group to put together recommendations for the Commission. Katy, Tim, Val, Devin, Celeste Rick, Shannon and if needed Anni have volunteered to help.

Prevention Landscape – Katy:

Need to understand for planning so as not to recommend things that are already happening.

Here's what we know:

Alcohol Fund is currently used to fund:

Life of an Athlete (LOA) \$250,000

Juvenile Diversion \$88,000 *appears separate from prevention line

SB533 expanded to include:

Prevention direct services \$819,00

Public Awareness \$200,000

Juvenile Diversion \$258,000

Current initiatives:

High Schools – PFS, SAP, LOA, Safe Schools/ Healthy Students, P.A.

Drug Free Communities Coalitions

Continuum of Care Coordinators – have an inventory of prevention assets.

What we need more information on:

NH's Promising Practice List

NREPP – Media Power Youth

What population/Demographic/age/gender/at risk –use NREPP 3 categories to compare each program.

Early childhood could have gaps we may need to look at, Michelle will send DOE list to Katy.

SPARK – will include programs.

LEAD

List of Police Department Permanent Drug Drop Boxes

Do we want to know who is doing DARE?

What is available for 18-34 year olds? Who would know? Colleges, Young professional networks? PFS council?

Should look back at the wish list from the 1st plan.

Childcare, afterschool programs, availability etc.

Slide 4 – data about young professionals? Need to include resources

Slide 11: change to parental loss include death, deployment, or jail.

Need some closing statements:

“while the science is there, we spend very few dollars on early childhood”

Include the number of children not able to receive help.

Finish the call to action – what do we want them to do? We want early childhood to be a focus.

Make sure they know there is hope – we CAN mitigate toxic stress after it occurs.
