PRSS Supervision

Discussion of requirement for supervision of recovery support workers by LADC-LCS/MLADC/LCMHC. Dean presented a proposal in support of the development of a sub-committee to create recommendations to be submitted for review by the Office of Medicaid and the Recovery Task Force by September 6, 2017.

Lindy recommended starting with the licensing board before developing guidelines.
Ginger invited Dean to attend a 3-day training in July in MA to become a PRSS Supervisor.
Dianne – Reminded us that Medicaid billing and supervision for credentialing are two separate processes.
