Questions & Answers

Q1. How much does it typically cost to run the program Navigating Recovery described, the Recovery Coordinator, etc. Can you supply the specifics (protocol tree), and who pays for the cost/how funded?

A1. The Belknap County Corrections group coaching is paid for through the Medicaid 1115 waiver funds (IDN 5 - Community Health Services Network). The Recovery Coordinator at the Fire Department and P.E.T. Coordinator at the Police Department are both paid for by those departments. Funding is not received for the referrals made through Probation & Parole or the Recovery Court.

Q2. Can we get a copy of the specifics on how all the presented programs were implemented?

A2. Each of the programs described grew out of local concerns identified by community partners. Implementation of programs are specific to the local community. It would be difficult to develop a generic implementation guide without knowing the needs of the community. Q3. Noticed so far that Mental Wellness missing from the content of presentations? How best to integrate?

A3. This community of practice is specifically focused on peer recovery support services for those recovering from substance use disorders or co-occurring disorders and is not specific to mental health.
