Maternal Health Campaign  Category 5: Public Education and Messaging	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Christin from CHI/JSI has sent consumer-facing materials to the group for the Maternal Alcohol and Marijuana Prevention project. The materials were developed through activities including focus groups, surveys, and formative research on women of childbearing age nationally, and in NH.</li> <li>A campaign will start with materials on alcohol messaging. These are in the form of posters and rack cards, which will be available at the Summit.</li> <li>Task Force members are asked to distribute materials where appropriate.</li> <li>The campaign will conduct a large unveiling and send materials to community partners along with a letter explaining the campaign. This letter could be shared on Task Force letterhead if the TF approves this decision. The letter would also have to be shared with the Governor's Commission for approval.</li> <li>At the end of January/early February, these materials will be used in a digital campaign targeting women of childbearing age, which will link to a microsite. These ads and webpages are still in development.</li> <li>The campaign will also develop a packet of materials to be shared with providers.
